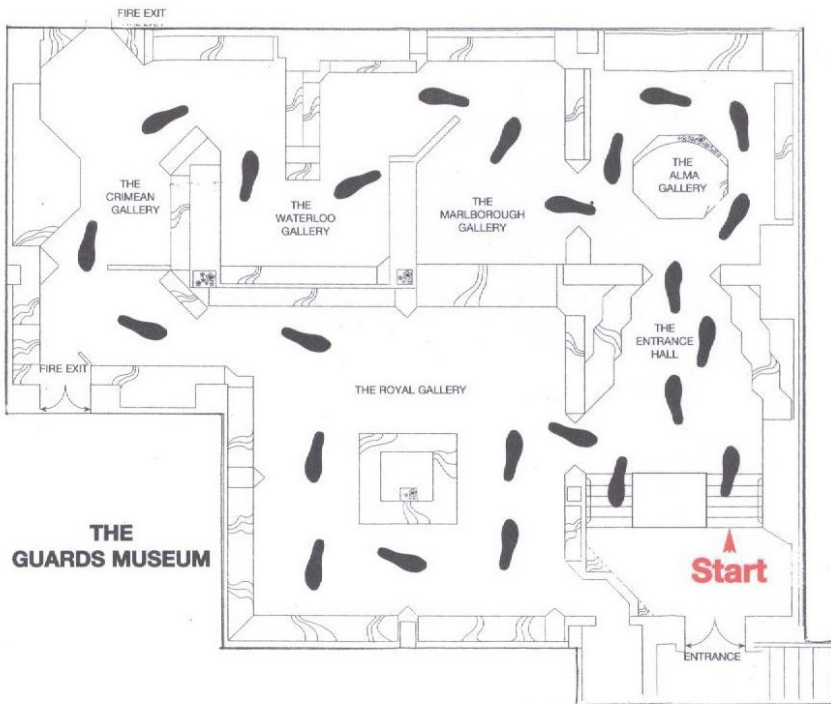


WELCOME TO THE GUARDS MUSEUM

Below is a map showing the way around the museum.

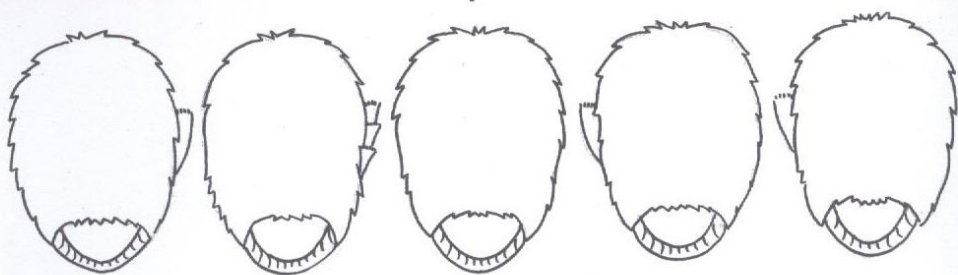

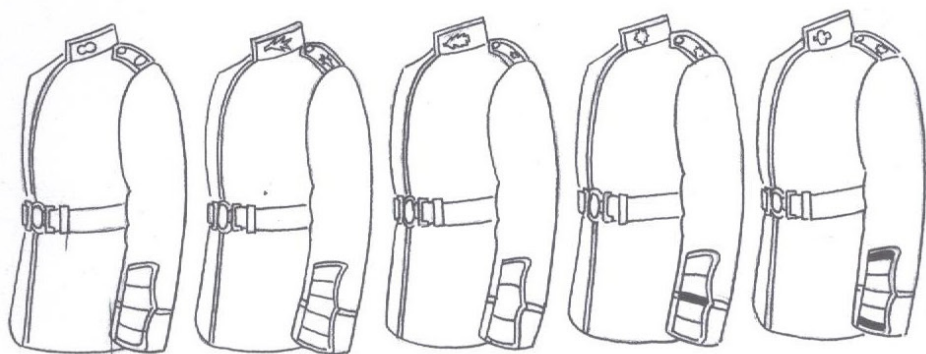

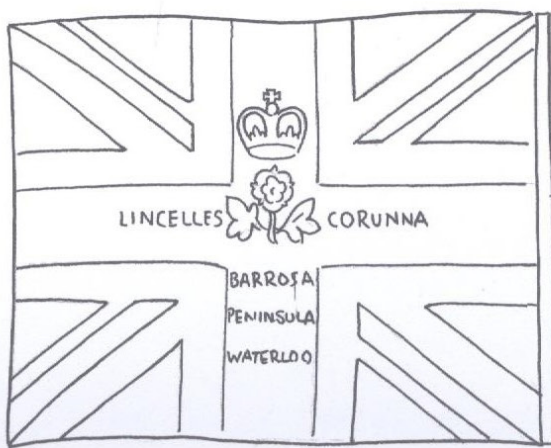

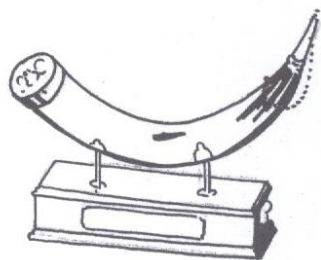

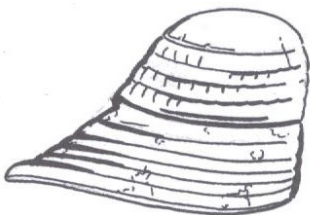

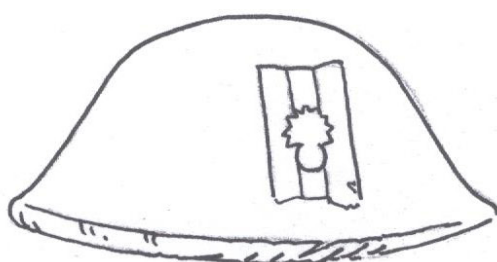
